Future Changes at Be Buckfastleigh

Be Buckfastleigh has been making good things happen since August 2019 – providing free and fun things to do to help people in Buckfastleigh, Bridgetown and Bovey Tracey.

Over 5 years we've supported thousands of children, families and adults with creativity and arts, essential food, help with energy costs, household support grants, early years, SEND, mental health and other services that are so often missing from our communities.

We've been able to do this thanks to generous funding from a National Lottery Growing Great Ideas (*) grant to pay for staff, rents and other project costs, but unfortunately this funding ends in July, and we will be adapting our approach from September so that we can continue to deliver our priority projects and activities.

The most important change is that after September, we will no longer have our core team of Becci, Emma and Rachel permanently in place to manage the work, and we will be leaving our base at The Living Room in Fore Street, Buckfastleigh. Team members will work remotely on a project-by-project basis as funding allows and will initially be focused on three priority projects - Little Lambs and the Social Supermarket in Buckfastleigh, and Hello Summer with our partners in Buckfastleigh, Bridgetown and Bovey Tracey.

Over the years, we have been very successful in accessing lots of big and small grants and funding streams from a wide range of organisations to provide all our activities and projects. The funding landscape is constantly changing and demands for funding are rising, with competing projects locally, regionally and nationally spreading the available funding more tightly, especially in poorer rural places. We will continue to seek out funding opportunities for all our projects as the opportunities arise and will be reviewing how best to make our existing projects more sustainable in the longer term.

Better Places / Be Buckfastleigh will continue our work to champion small rural communities, prioritising people in the greatest need, with the worst access to activities and support, and too often the least say in the decisions that affect them.

Buckfast Abbey Seeking New Choristers for its Choir

Buckfast Abbey is seeking boy or girl choristers to join its choir.

Children aged between 7–12 are invited to audition to join the chorister programme. The Abbey provides a generous scholarship for each chorister which covers the cost of receiving a superb musical education.

All that is required for the auditions is a love of singing and a willingness to commit to the choir's schedule of rehearsals and services.

New choristers will become part of a talented team of child singers whose voices enhance the Abbey's worship each week. Choristers perform at services, high-profile concerts, both in the Abbey and around the local area. Each summer the Abbey Choristers go on tour around the country to perform to wider audiences, and recent tours have seen them travel to Liverpool and York, with their first foreign tour planned for 2025.

The choristers are trained by Robert Pecksmith, Assistant Master of the Music at Buckfast Abbey. Dr Pecksmith commented: "There will be many families in the area whose son or daughter has real musical promise, and who will benefit from the chance to become a chorister with us."

"All we are looking for is some innate musicality and a spark in their eye."

"In addition to developing musical skills, choristers also acquire lifelong skills such as self-discipline, concentration, good organisation, and attention to detail. And all this happens while playing a part in the life of one of the most beautiful and inspiring buildings in Devon."

The Rt Rev David Charlesworth, Abbot of Buckfast Abbey, said: "The choir enriches and enhances our liturgical life by drawing on the great heritage of church music. It also offers choristers wonderful educational opportunities as well as much fun and a sense of achievement. I encourage you and your families to find out more and consider an application."

The Valiant Soldier Museum & Heritage Centre

Woolly Sheep - There are a number of little woolly sheep, kindly made by our volunteers, hidden around the museum and a question sheet available from reception to help them to be found. The theme links to the town's wool history and is an ideal way to spend a couple of hours with the children. And of course, it's free entry for those living in the TQ11 area.

Holy Trinity graveyard project

The Valiant Soldier archivists have started to gather information about the location of graves at Holy Trinity churchyard. Since a fire destroyed the church and the records in 1992 it has been difficult to locate the graves there before that date. The Church of England's National Burial Grave Survey has not included Buckfastleigh, so the archivists have drawn up a research design to help them identify graves and record information. It is the intention to eventually make this information available to the public to locate the graves of their ancestors. Do drop into the Valiant if you would like more information or have any details that would be of help.
