Buckfastleigh Social Supermarket - Important Information

Due to the ending of our core funding we have had to look at each individual project we manage and ensure that it is sustainable and can fully fund itself not relying on grants.

So from Tuesday 5 November we will be increasing the suggest donation at The Social Supermarket in Buckfastleigh from £3.50 to £4.50. This has been a difficult decision but has been done to ensure the longevity of this great community resource.

Up until this point the donations to the Social Supermarket have paid for the purchase of food from Fare Share and the rental of the Football Club but Better Places has covered all back of office, admin, insurance and any miscellaneous costs but going forward this is no longer possible so this is why we have had to make this decision.

Any excess the builds up from your donations will be put back into the project and we hope to still have special events like Christmas and Father's Day as well as being able to buy in staples like household products.

For your suggested donation of £4.50 you are still getting incredible value by only paying no more than 45p per item with often one item alone being more than the donation. We will also be bringing out eco products every week over the next few months kindly supplied with a grant from the Nature Save Trust; including safety razors, cleaning products, reusable period products, drinks bottles, and hygiene items. All included in your suggested donation of £4.50!

As a local authority, however, we have a legal duty to ensure that the display is compliant with health and safety regulations, insurance and risk. The initial outlay will require new infrastructure as we are not permitted to run from domestic supplies and the previous equipment is no longer fit for purpose. Council Grants: The Town Council is committed to supporting community groups that make a positive difference to Buckfastleigh. Little Lambs Early Years Group - update

Remembrance Sunday

It is good that Remembrance Sunday, which this year falls on November 10th, is clearly valued by so many people in our town, and brings together such a large congregation each year at St Luke's Church.

The Remembrance service will start at 10.45am, giving the chance to hold the 2-minute silence as near as possible to 11am. The service this year will be led by the former curate of St Luke's Church, the Revd. Marisa Cockfield, who is now the Rural Dean of Totnes. After the service at St Luke's we will go up to the churchyard at Holy Trinity Church, where the wreaths will be laid on the war memorial. That service will start at 12noon, or very shortly after. Everybody is welcome to either or both of these services.

Remembrance Sunday never glorifies war, but it gives us the opportunity...

- ...to give thanks for and honour those who made such great sacrifices, particularly in the two World Wars
- ... to reflect on the need to stand against evil by all means possible
- ...but also to see that we must avoid simplistically taking sides where there is oppression and violence from both instigators of a dispute
- ...to reflect on the carnage that war brings, including in conflicts of the present day, where so many people are suffering grievously (Ukraine, the Middle East, Sudan, amongst other places)
- ...to see afresh the need to work and pray for peace.

Moor Threads Community Weaving Project Exhibition

Moor Imagination Community - 19 October to 3 November, 10.00am to 4.00pm. Free entry

The community-made woven hanging will be on display alongside many smaller tapestries made by townspeople during the project. Alongside is an exhibition and demonstrations of spinning, weaving and dyeing through the ages.

The Moor Threads woven hanging

For several months, people throughout Buckfastleigh have taken part in creating this spectacular woven hanging that embodies the town's wool heritage. The Moor Threads Project travelled around the town, setting up the loom in community groups and organisations. St Luke's Church, Buckfastleigh Foodbank and Moor Imagination Community were some of the places where people took part in creating work. In the various locations, people were invited to add lines to the loom, choosing yarns and colours, to make it a true community effort. Many smaller tapestries were also made at weaving workshops as part of the project.

Woolly Nanas at The Wool Hub crafting centre has led the creation of the hanging and the workshops. All materials were locally sourced, and work involved included processing local fleeces, hand-spinning wool and hand-dyeing with foraged materials such as birch leaves, dahlia flowers and indigo.

After the exhibition the hanging will be on permanent display at Moor Imagination Community.
