# Dying Conversations - A Space to Talk, Listen, and Share

End-of-life matters are rarely discussed, yet many people have questions they've always wanted to ask. At the MIC Centre in Buckfastleigh, a monthly meeting provides a welcoming space for open conversation around this broad and meaningful topic.

This informal group meets over a cup of tea, offering an opportunity to listen, share, and explore personal thoughts and feelings. While the discussions are facilitated, there's no fixed agenda—topics may naturally include bereavement, coping with grief, preparing for dying, living with someone who is dying, funeral planning, wills, advanced decisions, palliative care, and more.
